

Arrival of Muslims- write brief history including dates etc.	There were non-practicing Muslims in Bermuda since the mid 1900's. First recognized Muslims were those who reverted to Islam from The Nation of Islam after the death of Elijah Muhammad in February, 1975
Current Number of Muslims and % of total population	Last census shows fewer than 600, just under 1% of the population.
Ethnicity of Muslims in the Community- description and percentages	About 50% indigenous – of African descent. The rest is made up of 'residents' from Trinidad, Pakistan, India, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, Malaysia, Morocco, Bosnia and other countries.
Mazhabs and Sects among Muslims including percentages	The four Mazhabs are represented as well as those who follow the interpretations of Warrith Deen Muhammad of Chicago. The majority are Sunni with a sprinkling of Shia, Ahmadia, Salafis, Murabitoon.
Comment on the relations between the followers of the different mazhabs and sects	All have very friendly relations, generally speaking. Sometimes the differences in akida creates tensions but they are not long lasting.
Muslim Relations with non-Muslims	There are no barriers in relationships with the non-Muslims.

Mosques or Musallas	There are two Masjids. 1 Masjid Muhammad # 1 on Cedar Avenue and Masjid –u - Quba run by the Islamic Center of Bermuda, Imam Ashmead Ali
Zakah- comment on its practice	The Zakah collected by the ICB generally goes to Darul Uloom, Trinidad. However, in cases of disasters in the Muslim world the Zakah funds are channeled there.
Waqf- comment on its practice	There is no Waqf at the moment.
Education- full-time schools	Sister Clara Muhammad Elementary School run by Masjid Myhammad.
Education- part-time schools/madrassah	Nil
Muslim women's institutions and activities	The sisters have at least one day out each year where they go to a hotel and spend the day with a full slate of Islamic programmes.
Muslim youth's institutions and activities	Several attempts to get the youths to function as a group for extended periods have been short lived.
